WHO WE ARE

OUR MISSION

MCHS Family of Services provides individualized treatment, care, advocacy, and permanency to children and families impacted by childhood trauma.

OUR VISION

Building a community where every child and family has a safer and brighter future.

We work collectively together and through partnerships to provide the best care possible.

FAMILY OF SERVICES

- RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT

Our main campus is home to youth, ages 5-18, in the foster care system. We implement evidence-based therapy, case management, and a restraint-free, trauma-informed care model.
- FOSTER CARE

With the support of our amazing foster families in the community, MCHS provides foster care and treatment foster care for infants and children impacted by abuse and neglect.
- ADOPTION

For children in foster care who are unable to reunify with family, we provide pathways to permanency and a safe, loving forever home through adoption.
- INDEPENDENT LIVING

Our independent living programs for youth aging out of foster care provide mentorship, life skills training, financial literacy, education assistance, workforce development, job readiness training and housing.
- TEEN INFANT PARENTING SERVICES

TIPS supports young, homeless parents, ages 18-24, and their children through housing, case management, life skills training and workforce development to break the cycle of homelessness.
- HEARTLINE

Heartline is a transitional living program for women re-entering the community after incarceration and provides case management, therapy, job skills training and resources.
- SENIOR PROGRAMS

With our Foster Grandparent and Senior Companion programs, we partner with hundreds of local organizations where senior volunteers can give back and support their community.
- CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION

Our prevention services include parenting classes and a free public Infant Resource Center for families seeking additional support.
- BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES

MCHS provides masters-level clinical therapy to children, young adults and families across our programs.
- UNACCOMPANIED CHILDREN

MCHS provides home studies, case management services and long term foster care to unaccompanied refugee children. Services include home settlement, language support, essential supplies and wellness checks.
- FOSTERING LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Authorized by Grand Valley State University, FLA is a trauma-informed K-8 charter school offering students a restorative environment to learn, thrive and excel.
- THE FOWLER CENTER

The Fowler Center serves children and adults of all abilities through summer camp, weekend respite camp, equestrian programming and travel adventures.
- MY FRIEND'S PLACE

My Friend's Place is a transitional housing program for youth experiencing homelessness. Residents receive housing, resources, case management and therapeutic interventions.
- MY SAFE SPACE

Youth experiencing mental health crises and emergencies receive immediate, 24/7 support toward safety and stability.





# STORIES OF FAMILY

## A New Home

Santiago counted on one hand the English phrases he knew. Still, he found himself at just 14 years old, along with his 10-year-old cousin Luis, trafficked into the country for labor. They knew only one person in the US, an uncle living in Detroit. Alongside MCHS and with their uncle, they settled into their new home. It wasn't easy, but they did it together. MCHS provided English language resources, enrolled both youth in school and provided supplies and clothing. MCHS worked with local hospitals to help Luis through unattended medical needs which he experienced on their long journey from Mexico. While Santiago and Luis have endured a traumatic journey and have a long road of healing ahead, they know brighter days are in their future.



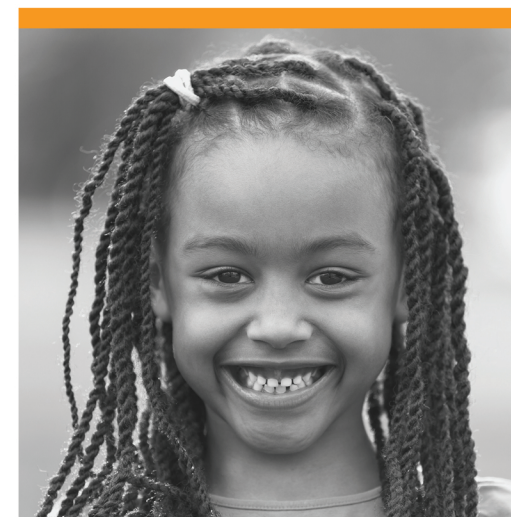
## Kevin's Story

Kevin longed for the day when he'd be able to have his own "home." At 17, Kevin came into MCHS care when his grandmother could no longer support him. His mother was incarcerated and his father was out of the picture. In our Independent Living Plus program for young men aging out of foster care and into adulthood, he thrived. He built life skills, job skills, an education plan, and even mentored new residents in the program. He often tells others in the program, "It gets better. It really does." Just three months before leaving the program, he entered an apprenticeship. After the apprenticeship, he received a full-time, stable job where he can build the life he's dreamed of. We're so proud of Kevin and the amazing obstacles he's overcome.

## This Is Family

Kenya couldn't wait to go to school. She knew she'd have breakfast and lunch there. She often didn't eat much at home as most of her mother's money went to baby formula and medication. Money was tight after her mother stopped working due to her brother's health complications. Yet still, she knew it would get better. School was also Kenya's favorite part of the day because she got to see Loretta's big, warm smile and hear her silly voices as she read to her in the media center. Loretta, an MCHS Foster Grandparent, had grown close to Kenya. One day, Loretta brought Kenya a

note for her mother. "Diapers, wipes, formula, so much more," the note read along with a phone number. Reluctantly, Kenya's mother called the number and reached the MCHS infant resource center. There, she was able to receive monthly supplies for her family, but most importantly, she found career resources that helped her find a new, stable job and child care.



## Safe And Sound

Dominique moved from shelter to shelter with her 4-year-old son Xavier. They'd been on their own for half a year without a place to call home after she gained the courage to leave her abusive partner. She knew that she, Xavier and the baby she was carrying deserved safety and peace. She came to the Teen Infant Parenting Services program just a week before the unexpected. Late one night, she entered emergency labor. An MCHS team member bravely and calmly delivered Dominique's newborn with EMS support on the phone. Dominique, Xavier and her newborn Malcom are now building stability and the future ahead of them with MCHS in their corner.

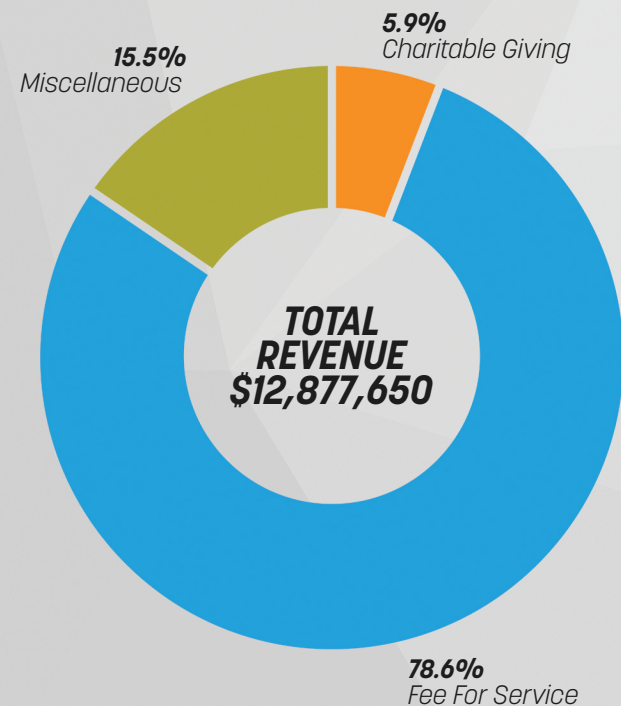

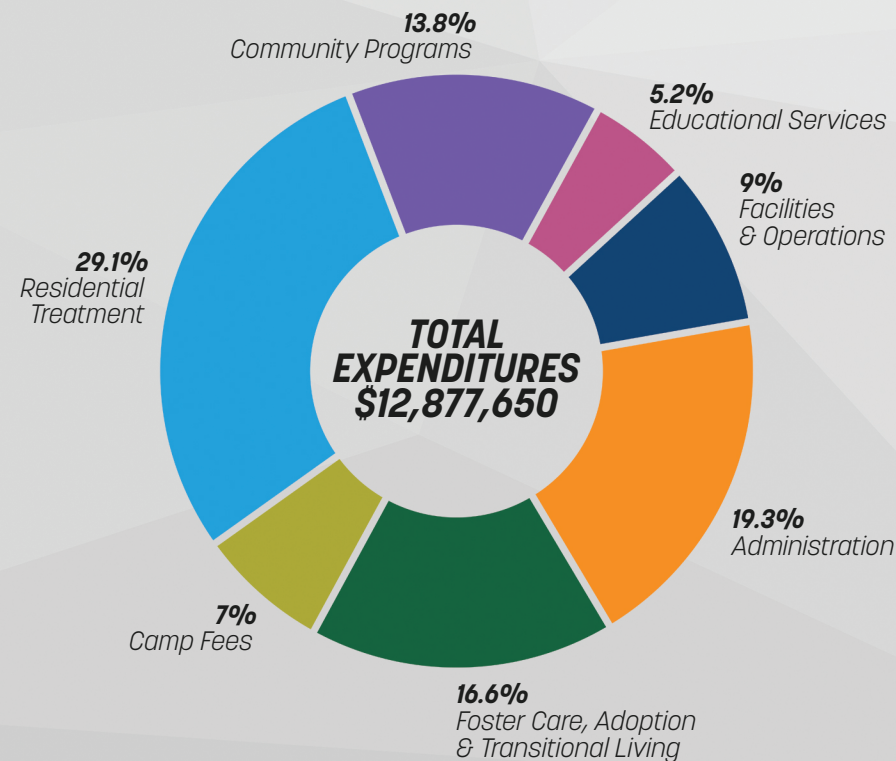
