

Whether it was describing our extraordinary staff, our passionate volunteers, or our generous donors, the dedication, hope, and love that carried us through one of the most challenging years was immeasurable. Those same words define our Board of Directors, our foster families, our legacy leaders in our senior programs, and all of our community partners.

And it was why we continued to grow and expand our impact at a time when we were needed more than ever before. Despite the enormous challenges we encountered, 2021 was an exciting year for us as we acquired The Fowler Center, which provides summer camp and respite opportunities for children and adults of all abilities and backgrounds as well as opened our new charter school, Fostering Leadership Academy, one of the first trauma-informed K-8 schools in Michigan.

Additionally, we served more children and families in foster care and transitional



living, as well as began laying the groundwork for My Friend's Place, a new campus in Detroit for youth aging out of foster care. We also launched our senior programs, Foster Grandparents and Senior Companion, recognizing the critical two-generational approach that our children and our communities needed to thrive.

At the heart of all this incredible work was the passion of so many to continue the proud legacy that defined our first 104 years and the renewed hope and opportunities that were in front of us. And while we were recognized as the Best Managed Nonprofit in 2020 by Crain's Detroit Business, we became even stronger and better, serving more children, families and adults than ever before.

From all of us at MCHS, thank you for your dedication. Thank you for giving us hope. Thank you for all the love you gave us. Whether it was our children in residential care, the homeless mothers in our transitional housing program or the students who just need more support in the classroom – thank you for the difference you made, the lives you saved, and the hope you gave.

Our Programs



Foster Care & Adoption

Through our foster care and adoption programs, we provide safety, love and permanency to children in foster care across the state to reunify with family or to find a forever family.

Transitional Living

Through our transitional living programs for young adults aging out of foster care, we provide mentorship, life skills training, financial literacy, education assistance, workforce development, job readiness and housing.

Residential Treatment

Our main campus in Redford is home to up to 60 boys, ages 5 to 18, in search of healing from abuse and neglect. We infuse clinical therapy, case management, recreational services and aftercare to ensure every child has a brighter future.

Child Abuse Prevention

We offer child abuse prevention services. parenting classes and a free public Infant Resource Center for families seeking additional resource.

Teen Infant Parenting Services

TIPS supports young, homeless mothers and their children through housing, case management, and workforce development to break the cycle of homelessness.

Senior Services

With our Foster Grandparent, Senior Companion, and Health and Wellness programs, we partner with many organizations so seniors volunteers can give back and support their community.

Fostering Leadership Academy

Authorized by Grand Valley State University, Fostering Leadership Academy is a traumainformed K-8 charter school in Redford and offers students a restorative environment to learn, thrive and excel.

The Fowler Center

Located in Mayville, MI, The Fowler Center For Outdoor Learning has been a beacon of joy, independence and learning year-round for children and adults of all intellectual, physical and developmental abilities since its founding in 1957.

Unaccompanied Minors

We provide case management across the Midwest to refugee children separated from their families with the goal of reunifying closest of kin. Services include settlement in foster homes. language support, essential supplies and wellness checks.



Who We Serve

Christian's Story: The Privilege To Dream


For eight years, Christian languished in the foster care system. A fire had started in his home while his mother was unconscious. At just nine-years-old, Christian tried to stop the fire but ended up in the emergency room. The following day, he learned his mother had died of an overdose, an addiction she battled for most of Christian's life.

With no family in the area, Christian was placed in his first foster home. Not long after, the family requested a new placement for him as they cited he needed more help than they could provide. This happened six more times before he ended up in a residential treatment facility in west Michigan.

Christian was extremely gifted, but he was so deeply misunderstood and hadn't been given the mental health resources to handle the trauma and loss he experienced.

Knowing that he would never be adopted at 17, he felt utter helplessness. Like so many young adults who age out of foster care, pathways were grim. His case manager referred him to the Independent Living Plus program at MCHS Family of Services. She told him it was a program for teenagers who are ready to work for their future.

Christian was at a crossroad. He had the choice to build his future or throw it away the way so many others had thrown him to the side. He chose MCHS. And while he knew that it would be hard work,



he quickly understood what it meant to find a community.

In a matter of months, with the support of MCHS, Christian was able to earn his high school diploma and plan ahead. He entered a workforce development apprenticeship program learning tangible skills to build a stable and independent future. The hopelessness and despair he felt began

to fade. The darkness began to feel lighter by the day.

Christian is turning 20 next month, employed with a local carpentry company and living in his own apartment. His dream is to run his own carpentry company one day. Christian's story is full of many successes and wins, but discovering the ability to dream once again is the foundation of MCHS Family of Services.

- Launched first aftercare services in Michigan for residential youth.
- 2 Secured the highest accreditation standards with Council on Accreditation.
- Launched Diversity, Inclusion & Racial Equity (D.I.R.E.) Taskforce to drive inclusion and equity within the organization and in the communities we live and serve in.



Created and implemented data quality processes to improve outputs and outcomes.

Significantly increased advocacy with elected officials and state leaders to improve services for all children in foster care.

- Implemented robust talent recruitment and retention plan to care for our caregivers, including becoming one of the first agencies to ensure a minimum wage of \$15/hour.

- Through enhanced focus on permanency, over 90% of our youth found love and permanency in a forever home!

- Launched Senior Services volunteer programs, which serves hundreds of seniors and youth annually.




- Grew from 33 licensed foster homes to 64, doubling the number of youth we serve in foster care.


